Roseway is a hotbed of free entertainment this summer, with both concerts and movies planned at our neighborhood parks.

The fun begins with Roseway's first **Concert in the Park** on **July 9** at Glenhaven Park as part of Portland Parks & Recreation's free Concerts in the Park series. Concerts begin at **6:30 p.m**. In addition to live music, there will be a rock-climbing wall and free hands-on art activities for kids beginning at age 6. Additional concerts will be held on **July 16** and **July 23** at the same time and place.

Concerts will feature food for sale by Roseway favorite Bacchi's Italian Delicatessen (sandwiches and gelato) and The Healthy Horse (desserts, popcorn and teas). Or bring your own picnic and beer/wine! The Missing Link will again host corrals to park bicycles and strollers during the show.

#### New Tree Code Protects Portland's Urban Forest

Portland's new tree code, Title 11 Trees, went into effect on January 2, 2015. The biggest change from the old tree code is that a permit is now required to remove trees on all private properties if the tree is 12 inches in diameter at breast height (DBH, measured at 4.5 feet above the ground) or greater. Trees that are dead, dying, or dangerous will automatically be granted a permit for removal and require one-for-one tree replacement. On private properties, trees that are within 10 feet of a building and trees on the nuisance plants list will also automatically be granted permits for removal and require only tree-for-tree replacement. Property owners will also be granted permits to remove up to four trees per year on private property if the trees are less than 20 inches DBH. Because more trees are regulated and tree replacement is required for nuisance species removal, the City anticipates that this new code will do a better job of preserving Portland's urban canopy than the previous tree code. ## The Roseway 2015 Concerts in the Park Lineup


#### Thursday, July 9

For Roseway's first concert of the 2015 season, we proudly present **the Barn Door Slammers**.


