Species include: Katsura, Orange-barked Stewartia, Western Red Cedar, Bald Cypress, and Dawn Redwood.

ROSEWAY PARK BLOCKS Almost 30 people came out for the tree walk on February 25. Hosted by the Roseway tree team in partnership with Urban Forestry, the event highlighted some of the new tree species planted in the past few years as well as the history of the Roseway Park Blocks.

We drew from Kathleen Wolf's 2009 book, *The Nature* of *Cities* and Dan Burden's article, "Benefits of Urban Streets," at www.walkable.org for our suggested answers.

- 1. Trees are simply beautiful.
- 2. Grandpa's blood pressure goes down.
- 3. Leaves absorb pollutants.
- 4. ADHD kids and adults are calmer.
- 5. Shade helps asphalt streets last longer.
- 6. Trees screen harsher lines of utility lines and poles.
- 7. Who knew, but drivers tend to slow down.
- 8. ...and road rage ebbs.
- 9. Home values can increase by \$15-\$25,000.
- 10. Finally, let' all hear it for:

We walk more!

Extra points for being able to recite Joyce Kilmer's classic poem, "Trees."

Hint: "I think that I shall never see a poem as lovely as a tree..."



The Pacific Northwest's Dr. Wolf has long argued that neighborhoods with tree canopies are healthier both physically and psychologically for residents. The sheer beauty of trees tends to draw us out of doors and we find outselves feeling like walking to the store or the library instead of driving. This is significant because according to the Environmnetal Protectional Agency (EPA) the average American spends 93% of their lives indoors (87% in our homes and 6% in our cars).

There is also what Dan Burden calls the "time in travel perception." This is where we tend to perceive distances with tree canopies as shorter than those in which "grey

visuals" of streets and building are not softened by the vertical greenery. Finally an environment that goes vertical with trees also soothes our psyches, say the researchers, leaving us happier and simply nicer to have in the hood.
