WHY PLANT TREES?

- Healthy Neighborhoods — Trees make our neighborhood more livable by beautifying streets, reducing noise, and slowing down street traffic.
- Clean Air — The average mature tree will absorb ten pounds of pollutants from the air annually and produce about 260 pounds of oxygen each year.
- Energy Savings — Trees provide shade and wind breaks reducing the energy needed to heat and cool homes by 15 to 35 percent nationwide.
- Clean Rivers — The leaves of a mature tree intercept an average of 760 gallons of rainfall per year, reducing stormwater runoff to keep watersheds clean.
- Fighting Climate Change — An average tree absorbs 26 pounds of CO₂ per year.
